Message from Our Executive Director

The beginning of a new year often comes in softly. But here at Family Promise of Southern Chester County, there has been nothing small or quiet about what this community made possible in 2025. This is a season for pausing just long enough to look back with gratitude—and then rolling up our sleeves and leaning forward together.

Last year brought meaningful milestones. We continued to grow and strengthen our apartment-style Promise House shelter, keeping families together under one roof while giving them time to rest, regroup, and refocus. We expanded our eviction-prevention work, helping families stay housed before a hard moment turned into a crisis. We deepened partnerships with landlords, school districts, churches, volunteers, and donors—each one a steady hand helping families find their footing. We watched parents regain confidence. We watched children return to school with a sense of stability. We watched families move from uncertainty to keys in hand.

That kind of progress doesn't happen by chance. It happens when a community shows up with compassion, consistency, and a shared belief that families are worth investing in. When people feel supported, they rise—and we saw that again and again in 2025.

And still, we know there is more work to do.

Too many families are living one emergency away from homelessness. Our waiting lists remain full. Affordable housing is limited, and the need for prevention and stabilization continues to grow. So while we are proud of how far we've come, we are just as clear-eyed about what lies ahead.

As we look toward the year ahead, our focus remains steady:

- ▷ Strengthening eviction prevention and landlord partnerships
- ▷ Expanding mentoring and life-skills support for parents
- ▷ Supporting housing stability for families with school-aged children
- ▷ Building systems that allow us to respond with urgency, care, and dignity

At its heart, Family Promise is about people—about walking alongside families during hard seasons and reminding them they don't have to do it alone. We will keep doing this work until every child has a safe, stable place to call home.


Thank you for standing with us, believing in this mission, and helping turn compassion into action. I'm grateful for you—and hopeful for what we will continue to build together.

Annual Appeal

When a family walks through the doors of Family Promise, they are often carrying more than a suitcase. They bring uncertainty, exhaustion, and the hope that things can change. Thanks to the incredible response to this year's Annual Appeal, we are able to say "yes" to more families at that moment when it matters most. Our community came together to raise more than \$122,000—funds that are already helping families move from crisis to stability. These dollars support safe stays in our Promise House shelters, one-on-one case management that helps parents set and reach goals, and life-skills education that builds confidence and independence for the future. Because of you, parents are creating plans instead of facing impossible choices, and children are sleeping in safe spaces where they can focus on being kids. As the need continues to grow across southern Chester County, your generosity ensures that Family Promise can keep showing up with compassion, resources, and hope.

This is what community looks like in action—and we are deeply grateful to be building it together.

More Than An Address

“I grew up moving.

My father served in the Army for 20 years, which meant our family followed his orders wherever they took us. Before I even entered middle school, I had lived in six different homes, in three different states and one country. And that number doesn’t include the temporary housing that filled the gaps between permanent moves. The longest I ever lived in one place was four years. For me, it was manageable. I was outgoing, curious, and fairly adaptable. I could walk into a classroom not knowing a soul and walk out with a few new friends by the end of the week.



My brother was different. He was introverted, thoughtful, and deeply rooted in familiarity. Every move was harder on him. Watching him struggle made me aware, even as a child, that while moving may look like an adventure from the outside, it can quietly disrupt a child’s sense of stability and belonging.

After my father retired, my parents wanted to move back to Pennsylvania, where they were from. But my brother and I had a different wish. We wanted to return to Virginia—the place we had lived the longest, the place where we still had friends, connections, and a sense of community. It wasn’t about geography. It was about familiarity. It was about wanting something, anything, that felt steady.

Today, through my work with Family Promise of Southern Chester County, I see the other side of frequent moves—the side where families don’t have the resources, choice, or safety net my family did. I see children who change schools midyear. Children who struggle to make friends because they don’t know how long they’ll stay. Children who carry the weight of instability into classrooms, playgrounds, and bedtime routines.

Even when shelter is safe and temporary housing is provided, the interruptions are real. Routines are broken. Confidence is shaken. Childhood becomes about adjusting instead of just being a kid.

Family Promise exists to minimize those disruptions. We work to keep families together, help children stay connected to their schools and communities, and move families as quickly as possible into stable, sustainable housing. Because stability changes everything. It allows children to focus on learning, growing, and dreaming instead of surviving.

My childhood taught me that resilience can grow in many conditions but it also taught me that stability matters. Every child deserves more than just a place to sleep. Every child deserves a place to belong. That’s what Family Promise is building, every day.”



Frederick G. Wisseman


